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new neuromuscular blocking agents: do they offer any ...

The introduction of neuromuscular blocking drugs in 1942 marked a new era in anaesthetic and surgical practice. The anaesthetist was enabled to provide respiratory support during long and complex surgery whilst the surgeon was allowed access to body cavities without voluntary or reflex muscle movement.

Neuromuscular blocking agents are potent muscle relaxants typically only used during surgery to prevent muscle movement. They are structurally related to acetylcholine (the main neurotransmitter in the body) and they cause muscle relaxation by binding to acetylcholine receptors postsynaptically (which prevents acetylcholine from binding).

Neuromuscular-blocking drugs block neuromuscular transmission at the neuromuscular junction, causing paralysis of the affected skeletal muscles. This is accomplished either by acting presynaptically via the inhibition of acetylcholine (ACh) synthesis or release or by acting postsynaptically at the acetylcholine receptors of the motor nerve end-plate.

These new neuromuscular blocking and reversal agents allow for maintenance of an adequate depth of neuromuscular block intraoperatively and almost immediate recovery of neuromuscular function, a sensible goal as the risks of residual neuromuscular block are increasingly appreciated.

Medicine administration errors of neuromuscular blocking agents present significant risk to patient safety due to potential for unintended paralysis, respiratory arrest, severe permanent harm (including physical and psychological harm) or even death.
